CHAPTER ONE

CHAPTER TITLE \_\_\_\_\_ +

KEY VERSE \_\_\_\_\_

1 James a servant of God and of the Lord  
Jesus Christ, to the twelve tribes which  
are scattered abroad, greeting.

---

2 My brethren, count it all joy when you fall  
into divers temptations;

3 Knowing this, that the trying of your faith  
worketh patience.

4 But let patience have her perfect work, that  
you may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.

---

5 If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God,  
that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth  
not; and it shall be given him.

6 But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For  
he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea  
driven with the wind and tossed.

7 For let not that man think that he shall receive  
anything of the Lord.

8 A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.

---

9 Let the brother of low degree rejoice in that he is exalted:

10 But the rich, in that he is made low: because  
as the flower of the grass he shall pass away .

11 For the sun is no sooner risen with a  
burning heat, but it withereth the grass,  
and the flower thereof falleth, and the grace  
of the fashion of it perisheth: so also shall  
the rich man fade away in his ways.

12 Blessed is the man that endureth temptation:  
for when he is tried, he shall receive the  
crown of life, which the Lord hath promised  
to them that love Him.

13 Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted  
of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil,  
neither tempteth he any man:

14 But every man is tempted, when he is drawn  
away of his own lust, and enticed.

15 Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth  
forth sin: and sin, when it is finished,  
bringeth forth death.

---

16 Do not err, my beloved brethren.

17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is  
from above, and cometh down from the Father  
of lights, with whom is no variableness,  
neither shadow of turning.

18 Of His own will begat He us with the word  
of truth, that we should be a kind of  
firstfruits of His creatures.

---

19 Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every  
man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow  
to wrath:

20 For the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God.

21 Wherefore, lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

22 But be you doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.

23 For if any be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he is like unto a man beholding his natural face in a glass:

24 For he beholdeth himself, and goeth his way, and straightway forgetteth what manner of man he was.

25 But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed.

26 If any many among you seem to be religious, and bridleth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain.

27 Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

## II Corinthians

1 Paul an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, with all the saints which are in all Achaia:

2 Grace be to you, and peace, from God Our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

3 Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort;

4 Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God.

6 For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ.

And whether we be afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation, which is effectual in the enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer: or whether we be comforted, it is your consolation and salvation.

7 And our hope of you is steadfast, knowing, that as ye are partakers of the sufferings, so shall ye be also of the consolation.

8 For we would not, brethren, have you ignorant of our trouble which came to us in Asia, that we were pressed out of measure, above strength, insomuch that we despaired of life.

## II Corinthians

9 But we had the sentence of death in ourselves that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raised the dead.

10 Who delivered us from so great a death, and doth deliver: in whom we trust that He will deliver us;

11 Ye also helping together by prayer for us, that the gift bestowed upon us by the means of many persons thanks may be given by many on our behalf.

CHAPTER TITLE \_\_\_\_\_

KEY VERSE \_\_\_\_\_

1 Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to  
the strangers scattered throughout  
Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia,  
and Bithynia.

2 Elect according to the foreknowledge  
of God the Father, through sanctification  
of the Spirit, unto obedience and  
sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ:  
Grace unto you, and peace be multiplied.

---

3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord  
Jesus Christ, which according to His  
abundant mercy hath begotten us again  
unto a lively hope by the resurrection  
of Jesus Christ from the dead,

4 To an inheritance incorruptible, and  
undefiled, and that fadeth not away,  
reserved in heaven for you,

5 Who are kept by the power of God through  
faith unto salvation ready to be revealed  
in the last time.

6 Wherein you greatly rejoice, though now  
for a season, if need be, you are in  
heaviness through manifold temptations:

7 That the trial of your faith, being more precious than of gold that perissheth though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honor and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ;

8 Whom having not seen, you love; in whom though now you see Him not, yet believing you rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory:

9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

10 Of which salvation the prophets have enquired and searched diligently, who prophesied of the grace that should come to us.

11 Searching what, or what manner of time the Spirit of Christ which was in them did signify, when it testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ, and the glory that should follow.

12 Unto whom it was revealed, that not unto themselves, but unto us they did minister the things, which are now reported unto you by them that preached the gospel unto you with the Holy Spirit sent down from heaven; which things the angels desire to look into.

13 Therefore, gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and hope to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ;

14 As obedient children, not fashioning yourselves according to the former lusts in your ignorance:

15 But as He which hath called you is holy, so be holy in all manner of conversation.

16 Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy.

17 And if you call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear:

18 Forasmuch as you know that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers;

19 But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

20 Who verily was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you,

21 Who by Him do believe in God, that raised Him up from the dead, and gave Him glory

that your faith and hope might be in God.

22 Seeing you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unfeigned love of the brethren, see that you love one another with a pure heart fervently:

23 Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incurable, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever.

24 For all flesh is as grass, and all the glory of man as the flower of grass. The grass withereth, and the flower therefore falleth away:

25 But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached to you.

1 Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

2 By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

3 And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also; knowing that tribulations worketh patience;

4 And patience, experience; and experience, hope;

5 And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

6 For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly,

7 For scarcely for a righteous man will one die: yet perchance for a good man some would even dare to die.

8 But God commandeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

9 Much more then, being now justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him.

10 For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son; much more, being reconciled we shall be saved by His life.

11 And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we now received the atonement.
